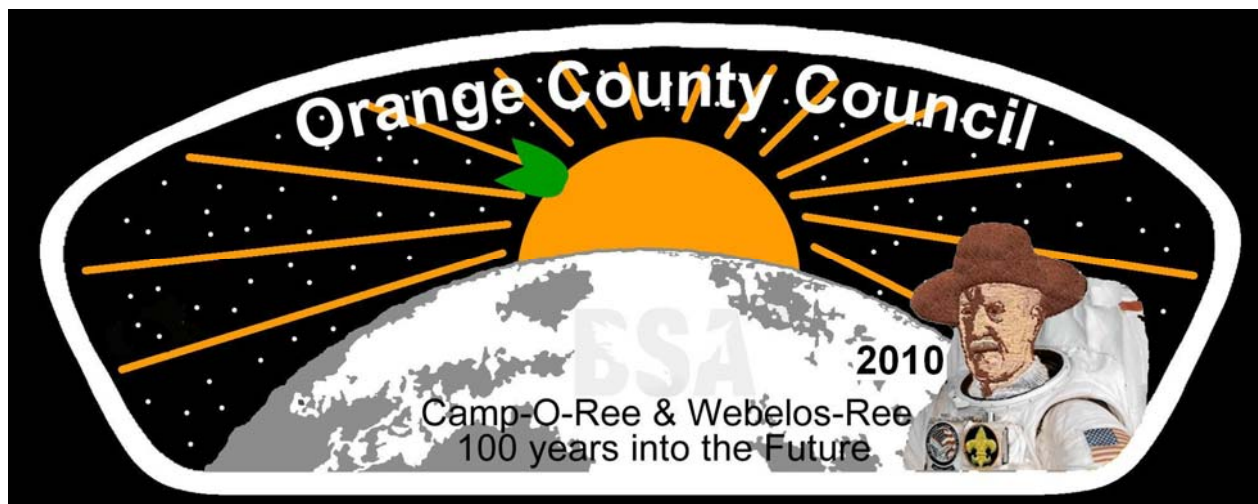

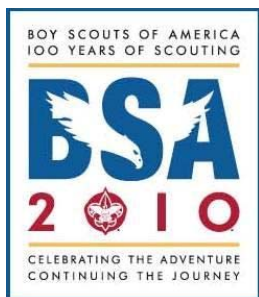

Dear Unit Leaders,

The Orange Frontier District offers you this invitation to attend Camp-O-Ree & Webelos-Ree 2010, to be held on April 23, 24, and 25, 2010, at the Los Alamitos Joint Forces Training Base. We are celebrating Boy Scouts of America's 100 Years of Scouting. Please join in this historic event.

This year, events are setup for each Scout, each Patrol, Den, Troop, & Pack to reach their personal best. This is a time for us to come together as Scouts in a celebration of skills, spirit, traditions, and challenges. This Camp-O-Ree & Webelos-Ree is designed to provide Scouts with an opportunity for fun, healthy competition, and lessons in leadership wrapped in a spirit of fun and friendship.

As usual, the Camp-O-Ree & Webelos-Ree Staff will need assistance running the events and with other camp related activities on Camp-O-Ree & Webelos-Ree weekend. As part of registration, we ask that Troops provide two adults or non-competing youth per Patrol to help the Staff in judging events or with other camp activities on Saturday. We also require Troops provide one Lead Judge who attend the Event Practice day in March and be available all day on Saturday, April 24<sup>th</sup> 2010 to Judge an Event. Bonus points will be given in exchange for their assistance. Identifying these volunteers is required as part of registration. Our events this year require special planning, and we would like to ensure that the events run as smooth as possible. The youth advisor for Camp-O-Ree & Webelos-Ree this year is JP De los Reyes – C199 and the adult advisor is Ron Cocchi – T658.

Remember to register early to get the maximum points for registration. All registration this year will be conducted at the January, February, & March Roundtables. As mentioned above, to get maximum Spirit points a Lead Judge Troop and two general camp staff helpers per Patrol must be specified at the time of registration. Check-in for the event will occur at the Joint Forces Training Base on Friday at 5pm, April 23, 2010. If you have any questions, please don't hesitate to call any of the Staff members with your questions. I, my Staff, and the Staff at the Joint Forces Training Base look forward to sharing with you this special event and celebration of a 100 Years for the Boy Scouts of America.

## 2010 Orange Frontier District Camp-O-Ree & Webelos-Ree

### What it is:



Camp-O-Ree & Webelos-Ree is a camping event for Boy Scouts and Webelos that allows them to competitively test their Scouting skills. This fun-filled weekend includes a series of events testing Scout skills, a cooking competition, and both campsite and uniform inspections. Scouts will enjoy this weekend of teamwork, camaraderie, and competition intended to bring out the best performance from all the Troops attending. *This year we celebrate 100 years for BSA.*

### Who can attend:

Any registered Troop member may attend. Families of Scouts are invited to attend the Saturday evening program, which begins at 7:30 p.m. Families may bring chairs to the campfire. Any registered adult Pack member may attend. Any registered Webelos I and Webelos II may attend. Any registered Bear (Cub Scout) may attend but must be accompanied by and tent with a parent or legal guardian. Bears **cannot** participate in events or tent with Webelos. Wolf, Tiger Scouts, and parents are invited and encouraged to visit Saturday as well as attend the Saturday evening program, which begins at 7:30 p.m.

### Fees:

**The January Camping Registration Fee is \$16 per person. Registration turned in by January Roundtable for 25 bonus points, 60% of the total attendees must be registered when this FORM is turned in with payment. See "Bonus points" for details.**

**After January Roundtable, the Camping Fee will increase to \$19 per person.**

**After February Roundtable, the Camping Fee will increase to \$22 per person**

**One check per Unit**

*One Lead Judge per Troop and one event/camp staff helper per patrol and den must be identified in registration materials*

### Fires:



Open fires are not permitted in campsites. Cooking with charcoal is permitted but you may not place charcoal directly on the ground

- Tour Permit:** A standard B.S.A. tour permit will be required for each unit attending this event. Two deep unit leadership & at least one YPT adult leader will be expected to attend with each unit.
- Set-Up:** A check-in area by the picnic area will be set up. Please keep vehicles to a minimum, as parking is limited. Vehicles carrying equipment *only* will be allowed to drive to the campsite for unloading. Please promptly move these vehicles to the parking area as soon as possible. All vehicles must be parked in the designated parking areas. No recreational vehicles will be permitted as parking space is at an absolute minimum. Campsite should be set-up by the Scouts (boy run), with minimum assistance from adults. Thereafter, campsites are to be maintained by Scouts.
- Facilities:** Drinking water may not be available at the facility. Each unit should bring a sufficient supply of water for the weekend.
- Trash Disposal:** **All trash must be carried home by each unit. DO NOT use Base Trash bins**
- First Aid:** Trained medical personnel will be on duty during Camp-O-Ree. However, first-aid kits provided by individual units are expected to be available at each campsite and will be an intricate part of the campsite inspection criteria. Be prepared to handle minor cases.
- Wildlife:** Although “civilization” is not far away, Scouts may encounter certain wildlife creatures. Please leave all wildlife alone. Please do not permit Scouts to dig holes on the base as their staff has asked us not to.
- Checking Out:** When your unit is ready to leave the Joint Forces Training Base, the campsite should be neat and clean. All trash must be carried home and disposed by the individual units. Camp-O-Ree patches will be issued after; an approved member of O.A. or the Camp-O-Ree Staff has inspected your unit’s campsite.
- Uniform:** The field uniform (Class A) for Camporee will consist of either Scout pants or shorts for Boy Scouts (it is OK to be varied), either long or short sleeved Scout shirts (it is OK to be varied) with the proper patches and insignias, Scout socks, Scout belt, Scout neckerchief (must be uniform if worn) and Scout hat (must be uniform if worn, all Scouts wear a hat or no Scouts wear a hat) as per the uniform inspection rules. The National Insignia Control Guide will be used as a standard. Scouts will be expected to be in their field uniform for the opening ceremony & campfire on Saturday and on Sunday during the flag ceremony, for Scouts Own, and (of course) for uniform inspection.

Scouts will be permitted to wear Troop / Pack activity uniforms (Class B) during the morning and afternoon competition events. The following rules apply to such uniforms:

1. The shirt worn must be uniform. (Different editions of a similar shirt will be permitted if the information displayed is similar)
2. Pants or shorts as well as belts, socks, and shoes, will not be judged but...

**NOTE: The wearing of military clothing (e.g. camouflage clothing) is strictly forbidden by National B.S.A. policy.**

**Patrol Method:**

Natural patrols are to compete in all events. Patrols & Dens are required to have at least 4 boys but no more than 8 boys in a Patrol / Den to effectively compete in the events. Smaller units or units with low attendance who cannot meet the 4 boy minimum should contact Ron Cocchi (562) 243-9691 (we can usually pair you up with other units with like conditions).

**Flag Competition:**

In order to compete Patrol & Den flags must be presented at Uniform Inspection Site on Friday between 7:00p.m. and 9:00p.m. Flags will be judged Friday evening and may be retrieved by the Patrol / Den Saturday morning before the opening ceremony. Flags will be judged on originality, the use of natural materials, unit identification with names of all the Patrol / Den members listed, and on how it is displayed. Patrols & Dens will be awarded 10 points for submitting their flags for the competition.

**Golden Spoon Award:** A Separate packet is available to describe The Golden Spoon Event.

**Competitive Events:** A separate packet is available to describe the competitive events. The packets will contain the description, rules and scoring of each event. One copy will be given to each participating unit. If we miss your unit please see the Camp-O-Ree or event chairman. This will be given out at the February Roundtable.

**Events Spirit Scoring:** Spirit scoring will be part of each event. Every Patrol & Den will be judged on the following criteria:

- 1) Patrol / Den Flag – To earn credit a Patrol / Den must bring their flag with them to the event.
- 2) Cheer and Song – To earn credit a Patrol / Den must perform an enthusiastic cheer and song for the judges.
- 3) Uniformity – To earn credit a Patrol / Den must wear matching unit or Patrol activity uniform shirts (Class B).
- 4) Patrol Spirit and Sportsmanship – To earn credit a Patrol / Den must demonstrate a positive attitude and show enthusiasm.



Members must encourage each other, even in times of frustration & work together. No credit will be given if there is any use of negative statements, arguing, or foul language.

- 5) Organization and Teamwork – To earn credit a Patrol must follow the leadership of the Patrol Leader and work together as a team.

Each Patrol / Den will be given a “Spirit Token” at each event that they participate in. This includes noontime spirit event, skit tryouts, uniform inspection etc.

### **Bonus Points:**

#### **Early Registration Bonus Points for all units**

25 points Registration Fee (60% of unit) Turned in *January Roundtable*  
15 points Registration Fee (60% of unit) Turned in *February Roundtable*  
*To receive bonus points all registration forms must be turned in including Patrol/Den registration sheet with one Lead Judge per Troop and one event/camp staff helper per patrol and den identified. Exceptions: Tour permit and Shoot Sports Permission slips may be turned in at March Roundtable*

Material for early registration bonus points is identified above. An **extra 25 points** for **all** paperwork turned in at **March roundtable** (patrol names, names of boys in patrol, all medical forms, names of adult scouters (one for each patrol and den) who is judging events. Only boys that are new scouts (Webelos) may turn in paperwork until April 8, 2010 for full credit.

**Firewood:** Firewood will be needed for the campfire on Saturday evening. Each unit can earn **25 bonus points** by bringing firewood to Camp-O-Ree and donating it for campfire use.

### **Campfire Participation:**

Patrols & Dens will be asked to sign up for skits or song or cheer for the Saturday night campfire. Extra 10 points will be provided for each patrol / Den that auditions. The Camp-O-Ree Staff will select the skits or songs to be performed at the campfire. Points will be awarded for auditioning.

### **O.A. Serpentine:**

Saturday night begins with a campfire procession called a “Serpentine”. O.A. members in Indian Regalia will lead the Serpentine. The Serpentine will pass through all the unit campsites. O.A. ordeal candidates will follow them; candidates will join the serpentine at the beginning of the procession. During the procession, the **“Bond of Silence”** is observed. Follow the serpentine until all participating reach the campfire. Any scouts or Scouters carrying a chair will be asked to sit in the back of the campfire viewing area.

Arrowmen are requested to wear their sashes for the Saturday night campfire and to help in the Serpentine. Arrowmen need to report to the campfire ring at 6:15 pm sharp.

## **2010 Camp-O-Ree and Webelos-Ree Scoring Awards**



### **Event Awards**

Awards will be given for 1st through 4th place based on performance scores. We will utilize a decorated ribbon or medal with the event name, event place, and added ornamentation as the award. You will also receive a certificate with the ribbon.

### **Spirit Awards**

Boy Scouts:

Patrol awards will include several Outstanding Patrol Spirit Awards. In each Troop participating at Camp-O-Ree, the Senior Patrol Leader will consult with his Scoutmaster and select one patrol from his Troop to receive an Outstanding Patrol Spirit Award. That patrol will receive the award and receive additional spirit points. The SPL may decline to present this award if he feels no patrols in his troop are worthy. The Ron Sheffield Perpetual Patrol Spirit Award will be presented to the patrol from all of the troops with the most spirit points. The Ron Sheffield Perpetual Patrol Spirit Award will remain with the winning Patrol for one year and then returned so it can be awarded to a Patrol at the next Camp-O-Ree.

Troop & Pack Spirit Awards will be given for the 1<sup>st</sup> through 3<sup>rd</sup> place, determined by the spirit points earned during Camp-O-Ree. Ribbons or medals will be presented to 2<sup>nd</sup> – 3<sup>rd</sup> places and a coup stick will be presented to 1<sup>st</sup> place.

### **Overall Awards**

Awards for the 1st through 3<sup>rd</sup> “Top Patrol & Den” will receive a decorated ribbon or medal for each Patrol & Den. A “Coup” stick will be presented for the 1<sup>st</sup> Place Patrol & Den.

Awards for the 1st through 3<sup>rd</sup> “Top Troop & Pack” will receive a decorated ribbon or medal for each Patrol & Den. A “Coup” stick will be presented for the 1<sup>st</sup> Place Troop & Pack.

### **Participation Ribbon**

Every Patrol & Den will receive a “Participation Ribbon” for entering the Flag competition. Special ribbon awards will be presented to the top 1st through 3rd place Patrol & Den flags.

## **2010 Camp-O-Ree and Webelos-Ree Scoring**

Each Patrol / Den will be given a packet containing scorecards for all events when they check in on Friday. These scorecards will each contain a unique identification number for each Patrol / Den to be used for computerized scoring of events.

Units should be careful not to lose scoring cards and will be responsible to see to it that scorecards are taken to each event. The Patrol / Den Leaders must sign each scorecard and make sure it is turned in for recording. Event coordinators will collect the completed score card and turn it into scoring.

Scores will be posted on a master "tote board". Troop & Pack adult unit leaders will be free to check the performance score of their units on the board. This will also provide a final check to make certain all scorecards are turned in before the close of scoring.

### **Events Competition:**

Each Patrol / Den will compete in events. Events will be scored based upon the "performance" score. Depending on the event, time and/or event spirit score will be used to break ties.

### **Top Patrol & Den:**

Top Patrols & Dens will be determined based on event performance score, event spirit points, uniform inspection scores, and miscellaneous spirit points, campfire participation points.

### **Top Troop / Pack:**

Top Troops & Packs will be determined based on Patrol / Den performance scores, uniform inspection scores, campsite inspection scores, golden spoon participation, early registration bonus points, bonus points for providing event staff and firewood.

### **Ron Sheffield Patrol Spirit Award for Boy Scouts Only:**

This top spirit Patrol award will be determined by the spirit points earned in the events competition by each patrol, spirit points earned during lunchtime activities, campfire auditions and participation, and additional points earned if selected for an Outstanding Patrol Spirit Award.

### **Top Troop / Pack Spirit Award:**

The Troop & Pack spirit awards are determined by the spirit points earned in the event competition by each unit, spirit points earned during lunchtime activities, campfire auditions and participation, Spirit Bear, Golden Spoon participation, early registration, providing adult volunteers, and providing firewood.

This form should be duplicated in sufficient copies for all Scouts and Adults. A signed and completed form **must** be brought to the Camp-O-Ree with unit leaders. *Please make two (2) copies for each youth attending Camp-O-Ree: one for registration at turn in and one for you to keep in camp.*

I request my son, \_\_\_\_\_, be permitted to go with his Boy Scout Unit on a trip to \_\_\_\_\_ on (date) \_\_\_\_\_. He is in good physical condition. Should any illness or accident occur to him on the trip, I will not hold liable the Boy Scout Council of Orange County, its officers, or leaders for said or for any medical aid rendered and will reimburse the Boy Scout Council of Orange County or its Leaders for medical or other expenses incurred in the care of my son.

I am ( ) one of the parents having legal custody, I am ( ) the parent having legal custody, I am ( ) the legal guardian (check applicable) of the above - named son, a minor. I hereby authorized the giving of first aid to my son. I further authorize any adult Boy Scout Leader on the above event to consent to any X-ray examination, anesthetic, medical or surgical diagnosis or treatment and hospital care to be rendered to the minor under the general or special supervision and upon the advice of a physician and surgeon licensed under the provision of the Medical Practice Act, or to consent to an X-ray examination, anesthetic, dental or surgical diagnosis or treatment and hospital care to be rendered to the minor by a dentist licensed under the provisions of the Dental Practice Act. Parents will be contacted immediately if possible. This authorization is given pursuant to California Civil Code, Section 25.8. If my son does require medical treatment, I authorize the treating authority to release him to an adult Boy Scout Leader.
